In all, there were 18 Dogs fishing the tournament, and there were only 20 qualifying fish caught, which included 17 northernns and 3 muskies. A slow bite and nippy temps made the early going difficult, but it did warm up to 50 after the sun rose, and ended up being a comfortable day.

Three lakes were open as tournament waters, but by the end of the day, all the teams were on Minnetonka, where the fishing was just as slow as everywhere else, I'm sure. It was a nice day to enjoy the scenic and large shacks while trolling for slimers in a Ranger bass boat, although some teams resorted to the even less productive method of casting.

The tournament was won by the team of Janitor and Chainsaw, who trawled up 4 northern from 21.5" to 27.5" for first place. Other notable fish were the a 32" northern for Griz, which was the largest point-scoring fish of the tournament, and a 31.5" musky for Juan, which was the largest of the 3 muskies boated. After the tournament, an enjoyable lunch was served at the Minnetonka west-side landing, compliments of the food committee.

In one of the closest tournament series races ever, Bob Blakely was on the winning team on the last tournament of the year to ice the first-place spot for the year. In all, The Janitor was on a first place team twice, both at the northern/musky tournament and also the trout tournament. He was the only one in the club to be on a first-place team twice this year, and finished with 76 points. Way to go, Janitor!

The rest of the field was close together in points, with less than 10 points separating places 2 through 7. This was a lot different from previous years, when a few guys ran away with the top spots starting early in the year. In second this year was FD with 64 points, and in third was Nasty with 60 points. There were six guys in the 50 points range, and another four in the 40's. The top three finishers will be presented with rods at the annual banquet inscribed with their tournament series win.

It was also a year when the tournament attendance dropped off from previous years, even though there were only six tournaments, compared to 7 in 2006. There was also just one overnight tournament, compared to two in 2006, and yet for a variety of reasons, the participation dropped off. Here are the numbers for the year:
